**An evening devoted to honoring the memory of
Sir William Wallace
(modern Scottish Gaelic: *Uilleam Uallas*)
1272 – 23 August 1305**

Sir William Wallace, a Scottish knight and landowner who is known for leading a resistance during the Wars of Scottish Independence, is today remembered in Scotland as a patriot and national hero.

He defeated an English army at the Battle of Stirling Bridge and became Guardian of Scotland, serving until his defeat at the Battle of Falkirk. A few years later Wallace was captured in Robroyston near Glasgow and handed over to King Edward I of England, who had him executed for treason.

Wallace was the inspiration for the poem *The Acts and Deeds of Sir William Wallace, Knight of Elderslie*, by the 15th century minstrel, Blind Harry and this poem was to some extent the basis of Randall Wallace's screenplay for the 1995 film *Braveheart*.
